QMT CODE OF CONDUCT FOR ALL SPEAKERS OF THIS CENTRE

The policy of the Trust is that the Centre is a place where **all** Muslims from any part of the world are welcome and **all** Madhabs respected. It is a peaceful place for prayer and study.

This policy carries with it responsibilities for speakers, who must strictly adhere to this code of conduct at all times. If a speaker breaches the code then he/she will be asked to stop. If a speaker feels he/she cannot comply with the code then they should not speak at the Centre.

- 1. No person may deliver any talk without the <u>prior</u> written consent of the Trustees.
- 2. Speakers must not promote their own or any particular Madhab. A balanced view must be given at all times about the various Madhabs.
- 3. Subjects which may be controversial in Islam or there is a difference of opinion should be avoided and only given with the prior written consent of the Trustees and subject to such conditions as they be decide.
- 4. Speakers must always give a balanced view of any subject or opinion without preference or recommendation. It is for each individual to decide what they believe and not for the speaker to promote his/her view.
- 5. Speakers must not preach or promote radicalism or make inflammatory remarks and must at all times comply with all applicable laws in the UK, including without limitation, incitement, hatred and discrimination.
- 6. Speakers must remember at all times that foreign policy can only be changed by lobbying MP's and through peaceful and lawful demonstrations and petitions and not through any form of violence as this is against the teaching of Islam and the law.
- 7. The Trustees have the right at any time to stop any speaker if in their unfettered opinion the speaker is in breach of the above code or for any other reason they deem fit without assigning any reason.

The above code may be amended form time to time, without notice.
